

ATTACHMENT 1- ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS FROM PROSPECTIVE PROPOSERS

Question 1: Is there any possibility to evaluate the whole completed research contract to satisfy the minimum requirement (30,000 USD) with at least two contracts rather than one contract?

Answer 1: As clearly stated in Minimum Eligibility and Qualification Criteria Clause under Annex 1: Description of Requirements, the proposers must have successfully completed **at least 1 (one) contract with a budget of at least USD 30,000** in area of providing similar services (preparation of baseline analysis and/or needs assessment, etc.) over the last 3 years. This value (i.e. USD 30,000) shall **not** be satisfied with cumulative value of multiple contracts.

Question 2: Is there a requirement to be registered in Turkey to be a provider for the services? If yes, can such a provider be a law firm based in Turkey?

Answer 2: As clearly stated in Minimum Eligibility and Qualification Criteria Clause under Annex 1: Description of Requirements, competition is open to all legally registered entities regardless of the country they are established/registered in. The prospective proposers are strongly advised to carefully review the terms and conditions of the RFP for further details of the requirements of the services.
