Section 2. Instruction to Bidders

A. GENERAL PROVISIONS				
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. This RFP is conducted in accordance with the UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures (POPP) on Contracts and Procurement which can be accessed at https://popp.undp.org/SitePages/POPPBSUnit.aspx?TermID=254a9f96-b883-476a-8ef8-e81f93a2b38d		
	1.2	Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.		
	1.3	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.		
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. 	2.2	Bidders/vendors shall not offer gifts or hospitality of any kind to UNDP staff members including recreational trips to sporting or cultural events, theme parks or offers of holidays, transportation, or invitations to extravagant lunches or dinners.		
	2.3	In pursuance of this policy, UNDP (a) Shall reject a proposal if it determines that the selected bidder has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question; (b) Shall declare a vendor ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, to be awarded a contract if at any time it determines that the vendor has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for, or in executing a UNDP contract.

3. Eligibility	3.1	A vendor should not be suspended, debarred, or otherwise identified as ineligible by any UN Organization or the World Bank Group or any other international Organization. Vendors are therefore required to disclose to UNDP whether they are subject to any sanction or temporary suspension imposed by these organizations.		
	3.2	It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture members, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by UNDP.		

4. Conflict of Interests

4.1

- Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
 - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or
 - c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists.
- 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:
 - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and
 - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

B. PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS

5. General Considerations

- 5.1 In preparing the Proposal, the Bidder is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.
- 5.2 The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the RFP. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP

6. Cost of Preparation of Proposal

6.1 The Bidder shall bear any and all costs related to the preparation and/or submission of the Proposal, regardless of whether its Proposal was selected or not. UNDP shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the procurement process.

7. Language

7.1 The Proposal, as well as any and all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidder and UNDP, shall be written in the language (s) specified in the BDS.

8. Documents

8.1 The Proposal shall comprise of the following documents:

9. Documents Establishing the Eligibility and Qualifications of the Bidder 9.1 The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence of its status as an and qualified vendor, using the Forms provided under Section providing documents required in those forms. In order to award a control to a Bidder, its qualifications must be documented to UNDP's satisfactors.	
10.Technical Proposal Format and Content	10.1 The Bidder is required to submit a Technical Proposal using the Standard Forms and templates provided in Section 6 of the RFP.
	10.2 The Technical Proposal shall not include any price or financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information may be declared non-responsive.
	Samples of items, when required as per Section 5, shall be provided within the time specified and unless otherwise specified by UNDP, and at no expense to UNDP
	10.4 When applicable and required as per Section 5, the Bidder shall describe the necessary training programme available for the maintenance and operation of the services and/or equipment offered as well as the cost to the UNDP. Unless otherwise specified, such training as well as training materials shall be provided in the language of the Bid as specified in the BDS.
11. Financial Proposals	11.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.
	11.2 Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.
	Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.
12. Proposal Security	12.1 A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal.
	12.2 The Proposal Security shall be included along with the Technical Proposal. If Proposal Security is required by the RFP but is not found along with the Technical Proposal, the Proposal shall be rejected.
	12.3 If the Proposal Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Proposal.
	12.4 In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall include a copy of the Bid Security in their proposal and the original of the Proposal Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in BDS.
	12.5 The Proposal Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Proposal rejected, in the event of any one or combination, of the following conditions:
	a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Proposal Validity specified in the BDS, or;b) In the event that the successful Bidder fails:

	12.6	i. to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder.
13. Currencies	13.1	All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals:
		 UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and
		b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above.
14. Joint Venture, Consortium or Association	14.1	If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
	14.2	After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.
	14.3	The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.
	14.4	The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
	14.5	A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
		a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
		b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
	14.6	Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
	14.7	JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

15. Only One Proposal	 5.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture. 5.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following: a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process; e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or f) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.
16. Proposal Validity Period	Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
	6.2 During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.
17. Extension of Proposal Validity Period	7.1 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Proposal.
	7.2 If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Proposal, it shall be done without any change in the original Proposal.
	7.3 The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Proposal, and in which case, such Proposal will not be further evaluated.
18. Clarification of Proposal	8.1 Bidders may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.
	8.2 UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.
	8.3 UNDP shall endeavor to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Proposals, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.

1. BACKGROUND

Ukraine has made significant strides in digitalizing the state and its functions. Successes of the Prozorro system, implementation of the national interoperability system for state registries (Trembita), increasing the transparency of public sector through the open-data initiative, development of digital public services under "My State in My Smartphone" initiative are well-known and documented. The Ministry of Digital Transformation (MDT) created in 2019 aims to continue and expand this trend. Most recently, the Government-launched the "Diia.gov.ua" e-services delivery web-portal and its namesake mobile application. These digital products embody the newest trends of digitalization for citizens.

With support from its partners, MDT aims to rapidly develop new and improved e-services that will offer an enjoyable and secure experience. Recently Ukraine saw the development and implementation of several high-profile e-services in different spheres – business registration, construction, birth related services (eMalyatko), and others. At the very end of 2020, MDT launched a mechanism for individual entrepreneurs to apply for state support in the most battered economic sectors. eService expansion, especially throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, helps citizens get nocontact access to governmental services. Such services also cut state administrative costs, bringing about more transparency into government-citizen interactions and slashing petty corruption.

Yet, rapid development of eServices poses a new challenge – widening the digital divide, that can marginalize people with disabilities, elderly, economically disenfranchised, those living in areas without internet access. With this in mind, UNDP started its new project - Digital, Inclusive, Accessible: Support to Digitalization of State Services in Ukraine (DIA Support) Project, that aims to support e-service development rooted in the Human Rights Based Approach (HRBA).

A socio-economic context analysis helps determine general priorities for choosing specific populations that need digital solutions adapted to their needs and capabilities. For example, retired women who have the status of internally displaced persons (IDPs) and live-in extreme poverty suffer multiple vulnerabilities. According to the UN, in 2017, about 1.5 million IDPs were registered in Ukraine, with two-thirds of them being the elderly, and predominantly women. In rural areas, 48 percent of women lack access to adequate health care, 36 percent of women did not participate in decision-making in their communities, and 67 percent did not have access to broadband Internet at home.

In the Ukrainian context, groups that often fall through the cracks include women and men living below the poverty line; the elderly; women and men with different types of disabilities; women living in rural areas; young people living in conflict-affected areas; ethnic minorities (particularly the Roma) and the IDPs. Veterans returning to civilian life are another group in focus. Appropriate digital solutions for these target groups are likely to differ from the models that are suitable for large-city dwellers or those with a medium or above-medium income and round-the-clock access to quality Internet.

During first year of work DIA Support Project took part in implementation of number of e-services for vulnerable groups in partnership with the MDT on the "Diia.gov.ua" portal. Among implemented e-services are housing subsidies, allocation and recalculation of pension and additional 4 pension services and two services for IDPs.

During the first six days since the beginning of the invasion, as estimated by the Government of Ukraine, as many as 4,000,000 people have fled Ukraine, and a lot more people were internally displaced due bombing and shelling all over the country. This leads to unfolding humanitarian crisis and the MDT, as well as other government institutions and partners, plan to act rapidly and implement e-services, that should help address the consequences of this crisis and people's priority needs.

The MDT uses "mobile first" principle in e-services implementation, including urgent e-services related to crisis like IDP registration and "ePidrymka" monetary assistance. Taking this to the account, the MDT approached DIA Support Project with request to support further software development of the Diia mobile application. The Diia mobile application is popular and easy to use with more than 15 million user base. Currently, the list of e-services that have to be implemented is not identified yet, so to support the MDT request mentioned above, The Long-Term Agreement (LTA) modality will be used - mutual agreement with the supplier/s to provide the UNDP with team of specialists for implementation of software development tasks over a specific period with fixed daily fees of specialists involved. Customization and tailor made specific of each e-service, due to different business processes and information exchange procedures and parties involved, doesn't allow to fix prices for each task, value for money principle should rather be preserved through the secondary competition of qualified suppliers.

2. MAIN OBJECTIVE OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The main objective of the assignment, to be completed by a highly qualified vendor of software development services, is to **provide team of IT specialists for mobile application software development** according to requests for expansion of the functionality of the already operational "Diia" mobile application. For each request a specification and/or business process scheme/description approved by the MDT will be provided by the UNDP.

3. SCOPE OF WORK AND EXPECTED OUTPUTS

The provided software development teams of selected vendors (at least 2 (two)) will work with the MDT and "Diia" SOE to expand the functionality of the "Diia" mobile application. The MDT will provide approved business process scheme or description regarding each e-service required, based on which UNDP will create a service request to LTA holders, selecting the implementation vendor based on the secondary competition results. The "Diia" SOE will organize access required for software development of updates for the "Diia" mobile application.

The main technologies that will be used:

- **Backend:** Node.js, MongoDB, PostgreSQL, TypeScript, Docker.

In general, the purpose of e-services to be required is to ensure ability for user to:

- Throughout the application process, get verified against other state databases and get data
 from them for filling in the application (API secure data exchange and verification
 confirmation to be designed by the vendor);
- Securely submit the application, through the "Diia" mobile application to the corresponding system for further processing (channel and algorithms for transfer of application data to be designed by the vendor; once the data is successfully submitted, processing on the is complete);
- Receive a notification in the "Diia" mobile application regarding the progress of the application and resulting documents (if applicable).

The following functionalities should be available for the end-users of the expanded "Diia" mobile application both on the client and government side:

- 1. **Citizen-clients** citizens of Ukraine (18 years of age and older) are able to fill out, sign and submit an application for newly created e-services via "Diia" mobile application.
- 2. **Relevant government organizations** receive the information provided by citizen-clients in their applications, process this information in their own IT system, inform citizen-clients on processing results via "Diia" mobile application.

The "Diia" mobile application expended functionality may also include implementation of new digital documents.

Apart from designing the application forms for users, the vendor will be responsible for creating a duly secured data exchange channel to transfer relevant applications to the corresponding systems and implementing data exchange with other state registers for automatic filling of applications.

The data exchange connections should be implemented on behalf of the "Diia" mobile application to implement service provision. The "Trembita" data exchange system shall be used as a secure transport for data exchange if relevant systems have established connection via "Trembita".

The data input fields in all service forms must have appropriate checks of format and logic. The back-end of the "Diia" mobile application has to gather service use statistics and feedback statistics (including age and gender disaggregation).

The contractor has to provide warranty for the developed software at least 12 months after acceptance of the last deliverable.

Neither UNDP nor the vendor shall be held accountable for producing necessary documentation in the area of information protection or as related to complex systems of information protection. SECTION 2: Bidder's capability and expertise

All important aspects should be addressed in sufficient detail and different components of the project should be adequately weighted relative to one another.

- 2.2 Information about financial state past 2 years.
- 2.3 Quality assurance.
- 2.4 Explain whether any work would be subcontracted, to whom, how much percentage of the work, the rationale for such, and the roles of the proposed sub-contractors and how everyone will function as a team.
- 2.5 Description of available performance monitoring and evaluation mechanisms and tools; how they shall be adopted and used for a specific requirement.
- 2.6 Demonstrate how you plan to integrate sustainability measures (energy efficiency, environmental friendly approaches, gender equality support) in the execution of the contract.
- 2.7 Examples of previous relevant projects implemented.

SECTION 3: Management Structure and Key Personnel

- 3.1 Describe the overall management approach toward planning and implementing the project. Include an organization chart for the management of the project describing the relationship of key positions and designations. Provide a spreadsheet to show the activities of each personnel and the time allocated for his/her involvement.
- 3.2 Provide CVs for key personnel that will be provided to support the implementation of this project using the format below. CVs should demonstrate qualifications in areas relevant to the Scope of Services.
