Section 2. Instruction to Bidders

		GENERAL PROVISIONS
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. This RFP is conducted in accordance with the UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures (POPP) on Contracts and Procurement which can be accessed at https://popp.undp.org/SitePages/POPPBSUnit.aspx?TermID=254a9f96-b883-476a-8ef8-e81f93a2b38d Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.
	1.3	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. 12.Proposal Security	12.1	A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty (30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal.	

12.2 The Proposal Security shall be included along with the Technical Proposal. Currencies 13.1 All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals: a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above. 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint 14. Joint Venture. Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm **Consortium or** in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead **Association** entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture. 14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP. 14.3 The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.

- 14.4 The description of the organisation of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
- 14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
 - a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
 - b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
- 14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
- 14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

15. Only One Proposal

- 15.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
- 15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
 - a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
 - b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
 - c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or
 - d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process;
 - e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or
 - f) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.

16. Proposal Validity Period

16.1 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.

	16.2	During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.
17.Extension of Proposal Validity Period	17.1	In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. 29.Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification	29.1 Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).

A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. Scope of Work – Firm Responsibilities

To achieve the above objectives, UNDP, in collaboration with the Government of KP, wishes to acquire the services of a private firm for conducting a phone-based survey. The implementing partners will administer 2 variants of the designed questionnaires in two surveys. Variant 1 will be administered from a total of 10,000 randomly selected respondents from Merged Areas respondents and Variant 2 will be administered from a random sample of 1,000 respondents who will be randomly selected from the 10,000 respondents who participated in the first survey. 1. Telephone based Survey 1:

The respondents will be answering the questions using a specifically designed app. The incentive will be transferred in a form of mobile balance transfer / Top-up in real time.

3. Telephone Remote Technology based FGDs 2.

Focus Group Discussions will be administered to a group of Elders, Youth, Women and Traders to elicit deeper insights into border management issues, trade potential and economic linkages across the border. A total of 10 FDGs will be conducted. The expected FDG will take 1 hour and 30 mints. UNDP will provide points of discussion, questions, and guidance notes for the FGDs.

Details of Responsibilities and Activates:

1. UNDP.

i. Study design, questionnaires, elicitation methods and implementation protocols for surveys and FDGs will be developed and provided by UNDP. All these will be provided to the firm at the time of Contract Signing- to be considered as pre-requisite of the contract award.

- **ii.** Finalize the questionnaire within 2 days after reviewing the pilot test dataset and report and share it with the firm.
- iii. Randomized list of 1000 to be shared with Firm in 2 days before the pilot test of variant 2 questionnaire.

2. Firm for Telephone and App Based Surveys:

i. Questionnaire Modules Development for Survey Software and App: The firm is required to administer the telephonic interviews through a survey software, the questionnaires module for the survey software will also be developed by the firm.

The survey software features must include system-based dialing, call recording, real time balance transfer, database for dataset tabulation and dataset generation as per the UNDP Experts requirement.

The firm will develop app for the app-based survey 2. The app development activity will be performed parallel with telephone-based survey 1. Before the app pilot test the firm will demonstrate a prototype. The app features need to have real time balance transfer, and choices / responses recording in offline mode.

- iii. This will help fine tune the questionnaires for the telephonic survey. The pilot would be conducted on 0.5% of the total sample size. For the pilot activity the firm will generate and submit a tabulated and coded dataset and report as a first deliverable.
- iv. **Telephone Based Survey 1:** After pilot, the firm will telephonically collect information on the finalized Variant 1 questionnaire from randomly selected 10,000 respondents from merged areas. Upon achieving the given respondent's sample, a clean, tabulated, and coded dataset will be generated as per the required format and submitted to UNDP as a **second deliverable**.
- v. **App Pilot Dataset and Report:** Before securing a large data set, an app pilot test would be conducted to find the feasibility and implement-ability of the variant 2 of the questionnaire designed through app for the interviews. This will help fine tune the questionnaires for the telephonic survey. The pilot would be conducted on 2% of the

total sample size. For the pilot activity the firm will generate and submit a tabulated and coded dataset and report as a **third deliverable**.

vi. App based Survey 2 (with embedded Dictator Game): After App pilot, the firm will telephonically guide participant on app installation and form filling. The questionnaire responses will be recoded via app on the finalized Variant 2 questionnaire with embedded dictator game, from a random sample of 1,000 respondents who will be randomly selected from the 10,000 respondents who participated in the telephone-based survey 1. Upon achieving the given respondent's sample, a clean, tabulated, and coded dataset will be generated as per the required format and submitted to UNDP as a fourth and final deliverable.

vii. Remote FGDs.

The firm will conduct these FDGs in parallel with App based Survey 2 10 technology based FGDs with a group of Elders, Youth, Women and Traders, a group not less than 6 participants. The discussions points, questions list, and responses recording sheets will be shared by UNDP, the firm will share the responses sheet in form of a clean, and tabulated dataset.

Quality Assurance Framework

Data Validation:
