	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this ITB, including any amendments made in writing by UNDP. 1. Introduction	1.2	Any Bid submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Bid by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this ITB.
	1.3	UNDP reserves the right to cancel the procurement process at any stage without any liability of any kind for UNDP, upon notice to the bidders or publication of cancellation notice on UNDP website.
	1.4	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (www.ungm.org). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.

Withdrawal,	4.2 Manual and Email submissions: A bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Bid by sending a written notice to UNDP, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of Attorney). The corresponding substitution or modification of the Bid, if any, must accompany the respective written notice. Preliminary Examination	28.1 UNDP shall examine the Bids to determine whether they are complete with respect to minimum documentary requirements, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Bids are generally in order, among other indicators that may be used at this stage. UNDP reserves the right to reject any Bid at this stage.
	29.1 Eligibility and Qualification of the Bidder will be evaluated against the Minimum Eligibility/Qualification requirements specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria).
29. 33. Responsiveness of	33.1	UNDP's determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the bid itself. A substantially responsive Bid is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements of the ITB without material deviation, reservation, or omission.

Terms of Reference

Remote Temperature Monitoring Services to Ensure the Quality of Vaccines in Indonesia

A. Background

One of the biggest challenges of the immunization program in Indonesia is the absence of real-time information on vaccine stocks that hinder health officials making quick and informed decisions. This is necessitating a call for an innovation to strengthen the vaccine supply chain by digitizing information on vaccine stocks and storage temperature remotely.

UNDP Indonesia in collaboration with the MoH of Indonesia has conducted a pilot project as a trial for India's approach for supply-chain management through SMILE application in 2 districts – Tangerang Selatan and Bogor City. Scaling up the implementation of SMILE application for vaccine logistics in across 34 provinces has become the sub-objectives of objective #5 of the Comprehensive Multi Year Work Plan (CMYP) 2020-2024, to increase immunisation coverage through immunisation supply chain and logistics strengthening. This CMYP on Immunisation Program guides all in-country programming and the design of immunisation related activities during the five-year implementation period, which also align with the Indonesian National Health System for deploying digital health information.

In recognition of good results of the piloting and first phase of the scaling-up period, UNDP Indonesia was appointed and supported by the MoH to provide provision for the distribution of >300 million doses of COVID19 vaccines to >10,000 health facilities with SMILE.

In terms of financial support, UNDP Indonesia has been granted one-year funds by GAVI under its post-transition engagement scheme to accelerate the efforts on strengthening the MoH's Logistic Monitoring Information System for Immunisation Program (SMILE project). As part of the initial scale-up plan of SMILE in 2021, the project will equip around 4,000 out of around 10,000 chillers in Primary Health Cares (Puskesmas) with Remote Temperature Monitoring Devices and services to regularly monitor the exposure of vaccines from heat and freeze while in chillers. This 3,900 RMTD includes around 619 Remote Temperature Monitoring Services that were purchased by UNDP in early 2021. The local government has been taking over expenses since March 2022 as the evidence of their commitment to continue better practice in provisioning vaccine temperature that was shown by UNDP.

Remote Temperature Monitoring have been able to record temperature measures over a long period of time to ensure vaccine effectiveness over time. Remote Temperature Monitoring Services for this program will not be a standalone device/hardware installed in vaccine storages (chillers) applying Internet of Things (IoT) technology, because the devices require local SIM Card and data package subscriptions in order to obtain then send temperature data to SMILE application. SMILE then be able to show nearly real-time temperature of vaccine storages that were equipped with these Remote Temperature Monitoring Devices and other services in Puskesmas and District/Province Health Offices through mobile phone and websites.

B. Specific Objective

Assessing further states' inclusion plans and requirements, UNDP country office intends to have a contract with Service Provider or Contractor for providing Remote Temperature Monitoring Services for 9 (nine) months with possibility for extension in order to ensure vaccine quality by providing service of remote temperature monitoring as

part of SMILE implementation.

C. Scope of Work

This section will allow the project to define specifications of the hardware and other services to ensure the remote temperature devices are functioning and transmitting data to SMILE applications in a regular manner.

All cost inclusive of hardware and other services, <u>therefore these 5 components must be delivered as one package</u> <u>by the service provider/contractor, failed to meet these requirements, UNDP reserves rights to reject</u>:

1) Logger (Hardware)

- a) The device with detachable probe that preferably reflects vaccine temperatures (<u>a probe buffered</u> <u>mandatory with glycol</u>)
- b) The device supports protocol of MQTT, HTTP and CoAP
- c) The device has real time alarm modes (SMS, audible or buzzer, email alert/app notification) for out-of-range temperature
- d) The device has USB port or internal storage to download report
- e) The device <u>has an onboard display</u> for temperature in Celsius with "99,9" decimals, signal strength indicator, battery capacity indicator, and remaining battery charge.
- f) Operating Temperature at least at range -10 °C to +30 °C, -90 C to +30 C (optional)
- g) Accuracy maximum at +/- 0.5 °C from -10 °C to +20 °C
- h) Logging interval at 15 minutes
- i) Every sensor is factory calibrated according to the NIST/ILAC standard or others and **must be proven with a certificate of calibration.**
- j) User programmable sample rate and alarm limits
- k) Provides GPS capabilities for location data
- I) Onboard software generates PDF & CSV Report download for last 30 days through USB port or other media
- m) Operating lifetime and shelf life: rechargeable lithium batteries must work for minimum of 72 hours on a full charge and minimum 3 years useful lifetime
- n) The thickness of the sensor cable and power cable that is inserted into the chiller/refrigerator must be thin so that the chiller/refrigerator can be tightly closed normally

2) SIM Card and Data Subscription

- a) The device pairs with (or including) **local SIM Card** and data packages (GPRS and Internet)
- b) Subscription services of data packages are included in this contract and paid upon activation of devices. Subscription period is fixed for 9 months with a possibility of extensions.

3) Connection Service

- a) Provides technical support on SDK, API, Back-End or any form, <u>in order to get data into SMILE</u> <u>software</u>
- b) Provides IOT Platform application with dashboard access for temperature monitoring and device management access with on-demand report capabilities (Back End Dashboard) **that could connect to SMILE Software through API**
- c) The device <u>can be integrated with IOT Platform SMILE</u> to send and display mandatory data on temperature, battery voltage, battery capacity, battery charging status, external voltage and optional for latitude & longitude.
- d) The device automatically sends data into the SMILE software through integration with the SMILE IoT Platform as part of the installation service so no software installation or any settings are required in the location

4) Delivery and Installation

- a) The cost of services will include shipment and distribution to 2,080 Health Centre or Health Office districts/provinces for Lot 1 (as listed in attachment for Central and East Java) and to 1,920 Centre for Lot 2 (as listed in attachment for MoH (DKI Jakarta), West Java, Banten, DI Yogyakarta, Bali & West Nusa Tenggara).
- b) Upon Delivery and onsite installation, contractors must ensure that the devices are well connected to SMILE Software to show temperature data and other indicators required.
