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1. BACKGROUND

2. SCOPE OF WORK, RESPONSIBILITIES AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED ANALYTICAL WORK

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS:

I. Academic Qualifications:

 High-level degree (Bachelor or equivalent) in environmental sciences, preferably in waste management, climate change, development studies, geography, or related fields.

II. Years of experience:

- A minimum of two year's professional practical experience in project management working with projects/ programmes in the field of climate change or related to adaptation and mitigation;
- A previous experience in working on waste management and coastal preservation is an advantage.
- Good communication and writing skills;
- Good experience in multi-stakeholder coordination;
- Outstanding capacity in working in multicultural context.

III. Competencies:

- Demonstrates integrity by modeling the UN's values and ethical standards
- Displays cultural, gender, religion, race, nationality and age sensitivity and adaptability
- Treats all people fairly without favoritism
- Fulfils all obligations to gender sensitivity and zero tolerance for sexual harassment.

IV. Language Requirement:

• Fluency in English and Khmer are mandatory for this assignment.

4. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

This is a <u>Lump sum output-based contract</u>. Therefore, the interested offerors are requested to submit <u>Final All-Inclusive Price</u> with cost breakdown.

5. EVALUATION

Offerors will be evaluated based on the Cumulative analysis.

- Technical Qualification (100 points) weight; [70%]
- Financial/Price Proposal (100 points) weight; [30%]

A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the proposals, with evaluation of the technical proposal being completed prior to any price proposal being compared. Only the price proposal of the Offerors who passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 100 points in the technical qualification evaluation will be evaluated.

5. 1. Technical qualification evaluation criteria:

The total number of points allocated for the technical qualification component is 100. The technical qualification of the offeror/individual is evaluated based on following technical qualification:

| Good interpersonal, communication, teamwork skills to collaborate with stakeholders and donors | 20 |
| Experience in wastewater management and climate change, preferably in Southeast Asia. | 20 |
| Total Obtainable Score | 100 |

Only the offerors who have attained a minimum of 70% of total points will be considered as technical qualified offerors.

5. 2. Financial/Price Proposal Comparison:

- Only the financial/price proposal of offerors who have attained a minimum of 70% score in the technical qualification evaluation will be considered and evaluated. The total number of points allocated for the price component is 100. Below is the formula used for this evaluation:
- Rating for Financial Proposal = (Lowest Priced Offer / Price of the Offer Being Reviewed) x
 100

5.3. Selection Method and Award Criteria:

The award of the contract should be made to the individual consultant whose offer has been evaluated and determined as:

- Responsive/compliant/acceptable, and
- Having received the highest score out of a pre-determined set of weighted technical and financial criteria specific to the solicitation. The total score for each offeror will be calculated independently by this formula: Total Score = Technical Qualification Score x 70% + Financial Score x 30%
