International consultancy to support the National Reforms Authority of the Kingdom of Lesotho in Security Sector Reforms

Type of Contract Individual Consultant

Post Level International Consultant

Duty Station Maseru, Lesotho

Duration of Initial Contract: Five calendar months, (108 consultancy days)

1. Context and project background

At the heart of the ongoing political tensions in Lesotho is the scarcity of resources and infighting for control of state power in order to access those limited resources. It has also led to conflict over the control of state institutions, including the security forces.

Lesotho's security sector (Police, military, National Security Services, the Immigration Department, and Correctional Services) is characterized by inadequacies including the absence of a security sector policy and associated strategy, outdated or unaligned sectoral laws, overlapping mandates, and politicization and factional leadership at the higher echelons of the sector. This weakens subordination to the civil authority, separation of powers, normal chains of command, accountability, the rule of law, due process and justice, impartiality of the institutions, and merit-based selection and promotion. Violations of human rights, including gender-related violations, and failures to apply the rule of law are common. This undermines the professionalism of the sector and public trust in its institutions. It also demoralizes the members of these organisations.

In 2018, the Government of the Kingdom of Lesotho in partnership with UNDP, OHCHR and UN Women, the Delegation of the European Union, and SADC formulated the Lesotho National Dialogue and Stabilization Project. It was publicly validated and internationally endorsed at the National Multi-Stakeholder National Dialogue Plenary II of 26 November 2019. The broad stakeholder acceptance of the comprehensive national reforms agenda and its focus on constitutional, security sector, parliamentary, public sector, judiciary, economic and media reforms, provides the opportunity and potential to address many of the challenges that Lesotho is currently facing, including those in the security sector. This led to a UN

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Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) project "Effective Implementation of Lesotho National Security Sector Reforms for Peacebuilding" (NSSRP) which was endorsed by the Government on 24 December 2020.

The NSSRP seeks to help establish the minimum conditions for successful SSR in Lesotho through the following Outcomes; first is the development, implementation and effective communication of a national security policy and strategy in line with Lesotho's international human rights and gender commitments and obligations with the engagement of civil society, sustained commitment of key political and security actors in order to provide a concrete framework for peacebuilding, professionalization, the depoliticization of security institutions and de-securitization of political institutions; second is strengthened internal and public oversight mechanisms to eliminate partisanship from security institutions, protect human rights including those of women, strengthen the rule of law and significancy reduce the levels of sexual and gender based violence in Lesotho; third, increase informal / community conflict resolution, negotiation, management and peacebuilding; and finally enhance government engagement with society and citizen participation in SSR and related peacebuilding initiatives (now and in the future).

2. Scope of work

This consultancy builds on the work of the UNDP consultant SSR adviser to the National Reforms Authority (NRA) from March to June 2022. In close collaboration with UNDP, national and regional stakeholders, other relevant partners and within the framework of the Multi-Stakeholder National Dialogue Plenary II Report of 2019, the consultant will support the Transitional Authority (TA) of the Kingdom of Lesotho in its national reform of the security sector. The primary objectives of the consultancy are to conduct a sectoral expenditure review, support national consultations on the draft National Security Policy (NSP) and National Security Strategy (NSS), and support the formal review of Lesotho's security acts.

The scope of work for the consultant is as follows:

- 1. Conduct an expenditure review of Lesotho's security agencies (corrections, intelligence, military and police) to support a government assessment of the affordability of proposed National reforms in the security sector.
- 2. Facilitate national stakeholder and community consultations by the authorities in charge of SSR on the draft national security policy and strategy,
- 3. Amend the draft national security policy and strategy to incorporate the outcomes of the consultation in preparation for their presentation to the government authorities.
- 4. Further refine recommendations for amendments to Lesotho security acts and support an expert legal review of those amendments to the point they are ready for presentation to Parliament (subject to the appointment or hiring of legal experts).

Other tasks:

- 5. Technical assistance to the Transitional Authority on security sector issues.
- 6. Advise the national authorities on appropriate and inclusive SSR mechanisms, structures and processes that can be used to achieve national SSR objectives.
- 7. Advise the TA on options to support SSR activities in Lesotho in line with international best practices and guided by United Nations normative frameworks and the African Union Policy Framework on SSR.
- 8. In collaboration with UNDP, assist the TA to consult with the relevant national stakeholders including civil society, women's groups, the youth, the international community, regional and other stakeholders on SSR.
- 9. Facilitate workshops, meetings and discussions at experts' level to inform decision making on SSR.
- 10. Submit monthly reports to UNDP and the TA and a final report highlighting results, achievements, challenges, and the way forward for the Kingdom of Lesotho in the implementation of SSR.
- 11. Any other relevant task assigned by the incumbent's supervisor (the UNDP Lesotho SSR Expert).

4. Institutional Arrangements

- The expert is responsible to the UNDP Deputy Resident Representative and will
 work under the direct supervision of the UNDP Lesotho SSR Expert for
 consultations on delivering the expected outputs.

- The consultant should have his / her own computer, access to internet and other logistical arrangements as necessary to complete the assignment.

The assignment will require 108 working days. The implementation of the assignment is expected to take place from 1 August 2022 with a <u>completion date</u> of 2 January 2023.

6. Qualifications and Experience

 Advanced university degree (Master's Degree) or equivalent in law, international relations, political science, or related field.

Professional Experience:

- A minimum of 10 years of progressive experience in security sector reform and rule of law technical fields combined with strong communication skills, of which at least seven years at the international level are required.
- Proven professional track record in developing national security policies, conducting security sector expenditure reviews and supporting SSR/RoL multi-year programmes in the field experience are essential.
- Experience in providing policy and strategic level technical advice and assistance on national security policies and SSR/RoL issues to governments at a senior level, in a multi-lateral setting is highly desirable.
- Proven capacity to engage with national and international stakeholders at a senior level

with strong liaison capacities and experience is highly desirable.

- Experience in Africa, and Lesotho, in particular is highly desirable.
- Field experience in complex environments supporting SSR reforms is highly desirable.
- Excellent writing and analytical skills including in writing reports, position papers and policy briefs are essential.

Competencies:

- Strong organizational skills.
- Ability to work independently, produce high quality outputs.
- Sound judgment, strategic thinking and the ability to manage competing priorities.
- Demonstrated ability to meet deadlines and work under pressure.
- Ability to be flexible and respond to changes to text as part of the review and feedback process.
- Displays cultural, gender, religion, race, nationality and age sensitivity and adaptability.
- Acting as a team player and facilitating teamwork.
- Learning and sharing knowledge and encourage the learning of others. Promoting learning and knowledge management/sharing is the responsibility of each staff member.
- Focused and results oriented.
