A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the submissions, with evaluation of the technical components being completed prior to any price proposals being opened and compared.

The price proposal will be opened only for submissions that passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 1000 points in the evaluation of the technical component. The technical component is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Term of Reference (TOR). Maximum 1000 points will be given to the lowest offer and the other financial proposals will receive the points inversely proportional to their financial offers. i.e.  $Sf = 1000 \times Fm / F$ , in which Sf is the financial score, Fm is the lowest price and F the price of the submission under consideration.

The weight of technical points is 70% and financial points is 30%.

Submission obtaining the highest weighted points (technical points + financial points) will be selected subject to positive reference checks on the consultant's past performance. Interview with the candidates may be held if deemed necessary.

#### I. BACKGROUND & PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Legal and judicial reform is a main goal of Viet Nam's national strategy, which has been highlighted in the five most recent Resolutions of the National Party Congress of the Communist Party. The Resolution of the 13th National Party Congress specifically underscores the need to improve the legal systems, mechanisms and related policies in the country. The Government of Viet Nam has made its commitment to this goal particularly clear by accepting the Universal Periodic Review recommendations, which call for "... strengthening the rule of law, including further development of the criminal justice system taking into account the human rights of suspects and inmates and promotion of impartial and transparent administration of justice."

The goal of the Government to improve the legal system, coupled with an aim to further Viet Nam's international integration, prompts the need to improve existing regulations and practice while also increasing knowledge and application of international legal principles and standards. Looking outward to learn from international experience can enable Viet Nam to fulfil their commitments in the field of criminal justice under a number of UN Human Rights Mechanisms, including the Universal Periodic Review (UPR), the Convention against Torture (CAT) and the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR).

## The rights of prisoners

The treatment of prisoners remains a challenge across the world related to safeguarding human rights in the criminal justice field. Article 10 of the ICCPR, to which Viet Nam is a signatory party, mandates that "all persons deprived of their liberty shall be treated with humanity and with respect for the inherent dignity of the human person." It also requires that social readaptation be an "essential aim" of imprisonment. Placed in a situation of deprived liberty, prisoners are to a considerable extent left to the mercy of prison officials and thus in a particularly vulnerable situation to be exposed to treatment that violates their rights. International human rights standards and law

does, however, underscore the clear duty and responsibility for States to take the necessary legal and practical measures to ensure that the rights of prisoners are fully and effectively protected.

In this respect, the role of officials in the criminal justice system, including prison officials, is of crucial importance in contributing to the increased respect for the right to life, security and dignity of all imprisoned persons. In their daily work, these officials also have the duty to ensure the effective implementation of existing domestic and international rules for the protection of the rights of people deprived of their liberty.

It is against this background and under the framework of the EU Justice and Legal Empowerment Programme (EU JULE) that the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Viet Nam collaborates with Police Department of Prison Management, Compulsory Re-Education Center and Reformatory, Ministry of Public Security (MPS) to equip officials and leaders in charge of management, education and rehabilitation of inmates with the necessary skills and knowledge about ensuring the rights of prisoners.

On the basis of consultations with the MPS, UNDP will recruit two consultants (one national and one international) to develop a set of documents on current regulations and good practices on the rights of prisoners, and to conduct three interactive training workshops for prison leaders and officials. Combining and disseminating research findings from a national and international context, the activities of the two consultants aim to contribute to assuring the rights of prisoners in Viet Nam in line with international commitments and human rights standards. This TOR is for the International Consultant (IC).

## II. OBJECTIVES AND REQUIREMENTS

## **General objective**

Strengthen awareness, engagement, and capacity of officials in charge of management, education and rehabilitation of imprisoned persons on how to strengthen the rights of persons in imprisonment. The activities of the International Consultant aim to contribute to the assurance of the rights of prisoners in Viet Nam in line with international commitments, good practices and human rights standards.

#### Specific objectives and output

- 1. To produce training materials that map the current provisions and regulations of international law and good practices related to ensuring the rights of prisoners and providing recommendations for further measures to be taken to mitigate the risks of violation of the rights of persons in prison under current regulatory frameworks and practices.
- 2. To conduct three (3) one-day training workshops, in close cooperation with the National Consultant, for prison officials and leaders to disseminate current domestic and international provisions, commitments and good practices regarding protection of the rights of prisoners, using interactive training exercises.

## Requirements

It is required to ensure that the set of documents and other content of training workshops are scientific, objective, practical, effective, interactive, and places the participants at the center. The

contents and forms of implementation must comply with Vietnamese laws, the regulations of the Ministry of Public Security, technical advisors, as well as those of UNDP.

#### III. SCOPE OF WORK

The consultant will be responsible for delivering the following two main products:

- 1. Deliver a set of material (in English) disseminating the provisions of international law and good practices on the rights of prisoners:
  - Research and outline the current legal provisions in international law and good practices related to the rights of prisoners;
  - Conduct desk research to compose dissemination on international laws and good practices on the rights of prisoners;
  - Based on preliminary research, produce a set of documents in English of no more than 15 pages. The documents shall include, at a minimum: a mapping of current international provisions and regulations related to the rights of persons in prison; an examination of international good practices related to ensuring the rights of persons in prison; and recommendations on measures to be taken to mitigate the risks of violation of the rights of persons in prison under existing international commitments and standards. The documents should apply interactive methods and exercises.
  - Edit and finalize documents before and after training workshops, including making all finalized documents available for translation into Vietnamese by the NC.

# 2. In close collaboration with the National Consultant, participate as trainer in three (3) one-day training workshops for prison officials and leaders

- In close cooperation with the NC, participate as trainer in three in-person training workshops (one day/workshop). Workshops to be delivered online if necessary.
- Training content is based on the set of documents mentioned in item 1 above
- The IC will provide their training content for translation by the NC ahead of the training workshops.
