# **Section 2.** Instruction to Bidders

A. GENERAL PROVISIONS				
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. 	1.2	Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP.		
	1.3	As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM) website ( <a href="www.ungm.org">www.ungm.org</a> ). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.		
2. 4. Conflict of Interests	4.1	Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:

specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process; Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP. 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether or not such a conflict exists. 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following: If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices. ## 14. Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

- 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
- 14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP.
- 14.3 The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of submitting only one proposal.
- 14.4 The description of the organization of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
- 14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
  - a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
  - Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
- 14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
- 14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

#### 15. Only One Proposal

- 15.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
- 15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
  - f) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
  - g) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
  - h) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or
  - they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process;
  - j) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or
  - k) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.

#### 16. Proposal Validity

16.1 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing on the

Period	Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
	During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.
17.Extension of Proposal Validity Period	17.1 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shall be considered integral to the Proposal.
	17.2 If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Proposal, it shall be done without any change in the original Proposal.
	17.3 The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Proposal, and in which case, such Proposal will not be further evaluated.
18.Clarification of Proposal	18.1 Bidders may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.
	18.2 UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.
	18.3 UNDP shall endeavor to provide responses to clarifications in an expeditious manner, but any delay in such response shall not cause an obligation on the part of UNDP to extend the submission date of the Proposals, unless UNDP deems that such an extension is justified and necessary.
19.Amendment of Proposals	19.1 At any time prior to the deadline of Proposal submission, UNDP may for any reason, such as in response to a clarification requested by a Bidder, modify the RFP in the form of an amendment to the RFP. Amendments will be made available to all prospective bidders.
	19.2 If the amendment is substantial, UNDP may extend the Deadline for submission of proposal to give the Bidders reasonable time to incorporate the amendment into their Proposals.
20. Alternative Proposals	Unless otherwise specified in the BDS, alternative proposals shall not be considered. If submission of alternative proposal is allowed by BDS, a Bidder may submit an alternative proposal, but only if it also submits a proposal conforming to the RFP requirements. UNDP shall only consider the alternative proposal offered by the Bidder whose conforming proposal ranked the highest as per the specified evaluation method. Where the conditions for its acceptance are met, or justifications are clearly established, UNDP reserves the right to award a contract based on an alternative proposal.
	20.2 If multiple/alternative proposals are being submitted, they must be clearly marked as "Main Proposal" and "Alternative Proposal"
21.Pre-Bid Conference	21.1 When appropriate, a Bidder's conference will be conducted at the date, time and location specified in the BDS. All Bidders are encouraged to attend. Non-attendance, however, shall not result in disqualification of an interested Bidder. Minutes of the Bidder's conference will be disseminated on the procurement website and shared by email or on the e-Tendering platform as specified in the BDS. No verbal statement made during the conference shall modify the terms and conditions of the RFP, unless specifically incorporated in the Minutes of the Bidder's Conference or issued/posted as an amendment to RFP.

## C. SUBMISSION AND OPENING OF PROPOSALS 22. Submission 22.1 The Bidder shall submit a duly signed and complete Proposal comprising the documents and forms in accordance with the requirements in the BDS. The submission shall be in the manner specified in the BDS. 22.2 The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder or person(s) duly authorized to commit the Bidder. The authorization shall be communicated through a document evidencing such authorization issued by the legal representative of the bidding entity, or a Power of Attorney, accompanying the Proposal. Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Proposal, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions. Hard copy (manual) 22.4 Hard copy (manual) submission by courier or hand delivery allowed or specified in the submission BDS shall be governed as follows: The signed Proposal shall be marked "Original", and its copies marked "Copy" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in the BDS. All copies shall be made from the signed original only. If there are discrepancies between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail. Proposals	23.2 UNDP shall not consider any Proposal that is submitted after the deadline for the submission of Proposals.
24. Withdrawal, Substitution, and	24.1 A Bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal after it has been submitted at any time prior to the deadline for submission.
Modification of Proposals	24.2 Manual and Email submissions: A bidder may withdraw, substitute or modify its Proposal by sending a written notice to UNDP, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization (or a Power of Attorney). # National Climate Change Vulnerability Assessment and Risk Projection to Inform Adaptation Targets and Actions

#### **PROJECT BACKGROUND**

Climate variability and increased frequency of extreme conditions associated with climate change present significant challenges and opportunities for the achievement of Iraq national development objectives. In this context, it is critical to fully understand how climate is likely to affect policies and measures in the future and how climate change will influence achieving development targets, and to strategize about risk mitigation and how to take advantage of emerging opportunities. The Government of Iraq wishes to embark on Vulnerability Assessment and Risk Projection in order to determine the degree of vulnerability to climate variability and change, identify opportunities that exist to reduce these vulnerabilities and inform adaptation planning. This work will help gauge the capacity for adaptation measures in Iraq to effectively reduce vulnerability, enhance adaptive capacity and build resilience.

#### **PURPOSE OF THIS CONSULTANCY**

The purpose of this consultancy is to conduct a Country-wide Climate Change Vulnerability Assessment and Risk Projection to determine ecosystems, Biodiversity, infrastructure, livelihoods and communities at risk to inform adaptation and resilience targets and actions

#### **SCOPE OF WORK**

As part of the support to implement the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC) and also in response to the growing extreme events such as drought, sand storms, water scarcity, the Government seeks to prepare a Vulnerability Assessment in order to determine ecosystems, infrastructure, livelihoods and communities at risk to inform adaptation planning, targets and actions.

The data collected will serve as an important effort to inform target setting in the short, medium and long-term to enable objective monitoring & evaluation of adaptation interventions.

This initiative is timely in light of the ongoing plans to elaborate on the adaptation component of Iraq's Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC), and to inform the next cycle of national development planning.

The study shall identify, collect and compile relevant documents, data and information (historical and updated),

stakeholders, describe the hazards, vulnerabilities and resulting risks to be assessed. These include:

- Stock take of past and ongoing risk and vulnerability assessments identifying gaps
- A description of clear climate-related risks to be addressed in the climate risk and vulnerability assessment
- Summary of existing baseline data and information and scope of the expansion of the baseline
- Provide details of the assessment methodology to be used in the climate risk and vulnerability assessment
- Provide an indicative timeframe, costs and resources to carry out the assessment

action to reduce risk being taken.

- Examine how conditions might evolve in the future (predictions by using IPCC scenarios and national data)

The characterization of future climate hazards may be based on data from global and regional climate models, down-scaling studies, and/or impact models (e.g., of water resources, crop yields, coastal systems, ecosystems, etc.). In addition, this characterization may employ expert judgment, past analogues (e.g., of extreme events/conditions), statistical techniques (e.g., to examine the impacts of changing means and variability of the occurrence of extremes using historical data as a baseline)
- The potential future evolution of vulnerability, based on reasonable assumptions about how the drivers of vulnerability may change in conjunction with changing economic, demographic, environmental and other conditions
- The potential future evolution of adaptive capacity, based on changes in access to resources and opportunities, and in constraints on adaptation actions.
- Methodology will be discussed in detail and approved by the UNDP-Iraq staff climate change expert and will be included in the inception report before the implementation.
