I. BACKGROUND

Understanding religious dynamics and the role of faith communities and actors is crucial for sustainable development. Faith communities, actors, and assets continue to occupy a critical space and validated by study conducted by Pew Research Centre found that 8 in 10 people still identify with a religion (2012). Accordingly, global development discourse and practice has seen a new wave indicating a turn to recognizing the significant role of religion. Greater portions of development aid are now channelled via faith-based initiatives or organizations, and religion is increasingly recognized as a human resource rather than an obstacle to development.

Many faith actors have also been involved in development policy, initially by adopting the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), and more recently through a commitment to join the global collaboration around achieving the new Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The SDGs comprise 17 goals with 169 targets that were signed by the 193 UN member states in 2015. The SDGs seek to ensure a more grassroots and locally owned type of development based on the recognition that "local people" are better placed to both understand and respond to development challenges. Since local societies in development aid recipient countries are often centred around faith communities, the engagement and role played by them becomes even more critical to the discussion on sustainable development.

Through integrating environmental dimension of the 2030 Agenda, religious and cultural communities can also promote strong, inclusive, green, sustainable, and transformative economies, based on circularity, sharing and collaboration, and alternative measures of growth and wellbeing. They can be instrumental in educating for more sustainable lifestyles and behaviours to achieve sustainable consumption and production, and in considering the impact of their actions on others. They can significantly contribute to ending extreme poverty, leaving no one behind when addressing multi-dimensional poverty and related challenges. They can also significantly address climate change, biodiversity loss, pollution, desertification and unsustainable land and water use, by fostering a fundamental change in attitude of the people.

A UNDP project, BIOFIN (biodiversity finance initiative) works to develop a methodology for quantifying the biodiversity finance gap at national level, for improving cost-effectiveness through mainstreaming of biodiversity into national development and sectoral planning, and for developing comprehensive national finance plans. Based on insights gained from the results of BIOFIN assessments, it revealed a significant financial need for the achievement of national and global biodiversity imperatives. Public budgets continue to be the primary source of direct funding for biodiversity in all countries, however non-public sources such as private sectors, NGOs including other faith-based fund are increasingly important.

BIOFIN in Indonesia has been working with BAZNAS in Selayar, demonstrated how Islamic funds – particularly zakat, empowers coastal communities to extend the value added of coconut and fish products, by supporting farmers and fishermen to expand the market. To extend the solution and expand the work towards exploring other faith-based fund initiatives in promoting strong, inclusive, green, sustainable, and transformative economies and further opportunities to achieve universal objective such as SDGs.

Therefore, we would like to procure an individual consultant to support mapping of religion-based conservation fund among other recognized religions in Indonesia.

II. SCOPE OF WORK, ACTIVITIES, AND DELIVERABLES

The consultant will work with the BIOFIN Project Management Team and UNDP Technical Adviser for Natural Resources and Governance. Consultant will undertake assessment of the opportunity for faith-based fund relevant to environment and biodiversity program within non-muslim religion in Indonesia.

Scope of work of the assignment are as follows:

- To review and assess the body of knowledge on faith-based fund collection and distribution within recognized religion in Indonesia
- To review and analyze the linkage between theology and ecology from the perspective of non-muslim religions in Indonesia
- To identify and map faith-based fund for each religion including source of fund, size, collection method, the usage, and mechanism with the context of SGGs, environment and/or biodiversity financing
- To synthesize the potential size of faith-based fund and opportunity to align them for SDGs, biodiversity and/or environmental purposes
- To recommend strategic action in engaging faith-based institutions for collaborating the fund and aligning with SDGs, environment and/or biodiversity
