SECTION 2. INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

GENERAL PROVISIONS				
1. Introduction	1.1	Bidders shall adhere to all the requirements of this RFP, including any amendments in writing by UNDP. This RFP is conducted in accordance with the UNDP Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures (POPP) on Contracts and Procurement which can be accessed at https://popp.undp.org/SitePages/POPPBSUnit.aspx?TermID=254a9f96-b883-476a-8ef8-e81f93a2b38d Any Proposal submitted will be regarded as an offer by the Bidder and does not constitute or imply the acceptance of the Proposal by UNDP. UNDP is under no obligation to award a contract to any Bidder as a result of this RFP. As part of the bid, it is desired that the Bidder registers at the United Nations		
		Global Marketplace (UNGM) website (<u>www.ungm.org</u>). The Bidder may still submit a bid even if not registered with the UNGM. However, if the Bidder is selected for contract award, the Bidder must register on the UNGM prior to contract signature.		
2. Fraud & Corruption, Gifts and Hospitality	2.1	UNDP strictly enforces a policy of zero tolerance on proscribed practices, including fraud, corruption, collusion, unethical or unprofessional practices, and obstruction of UNDP vendors and requires all bidders/vendors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and contract implementation. 	2.3	In pursuance of this policy, UNDP (a) Shall reject a proposal if it determines that the selected bidder has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question; (b) Shall declare a vendor ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, to be awarded a contract if at any time it determines that the vendor has engaged in any corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for, or in executing a UNDP contract.

3. Eligibility	3.1	A vendor should not be suspended, debarred, or otherwise identified as ineligible by any UN Organisation or the World Bank Group or any other international Organisation. Vendors are therefore required to disclose to UNDP whether they are subject to any sanction or temporary suspension imposed by these organisations.		
	3.2	It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that its employees, joint venture members, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their		

employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by UNDP.

4. Conflict of Interests

- 4.1 Bidders must strictly avoid conflicts with other assignments or their own interests, and act without consideration for future work. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Without limitation on the generality of the above, Bidders, and any of their affiliates, shall be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this solicitation process, if they:
 - a) Are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by UNDP to provide services for the preparation of the design, specifications, Terms of Reference, cost analysis/estimation, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods and services in this selection process;
 - b) Were involved in the preparation and/or design of the programme/project related to the services requested under this RFP; or
 - c) Are found to be in conflict for any other reason, as may be established by, or at the discretion of UNDP.
- 4.2 In the event of any uncertainty in the interpretation of a potential conflict of interest, Bidders must disclose to UNDP, and seek UNDP's confirmation on whether such a conflict exists.
- 4.3 Similarly, the Bidders must disclose in their proposal their knowledge of the following:
 - a) If the owners, part-owners, officers, directors, controlling shareholders, of the bidding entity or key personnel are family members of UNDP staff involved in the procurement functions and/or the Government of the country or any Implementing Partner receiving services under this RFP; and
 - b) All other circumstances that could potentially lead to actual or perceived conflict of interest, collusion or unfair competition practices.

Failure to disclose such an information may result in the rejection of the proposal or proposals affected by the non-disclosure.

4.4 The eligibility of Bidders that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDP's further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered, operated and managed as an independent business entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate and access to information in relation to this RFP, among others. Conditions that may lead to undue advantage against other Bidders may result in the eventual rejection of the Proposal.

PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS

5. General Considerations

- In preparing the Proposal, the Bidder is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.
- 5.2 The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the RFP. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify the UNDP

8. 11. Financial Proposals	1.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Form provided in Section 6 of the RFP. It shall list all major cost components associated with the services, and the detailed breakdown of such costs.	
	1.2 Any output and activities described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, as well as in the final total price.	
	1.3 Prices and other financial information must not be disclosed in any other place except in the financial proposal.	
12.Proposal Security	2.1 A Proposal Security, if required by BDS, shall be provided in the amount and form indicated in the BDS. The Proposal Security shall be valid up to thirty	

(30) days after the final date of validity of the Proposal. 12.2 The Proposal Security shall be included along with the Technical Proposal. If Proposal Security is required by the RFP but is not found along with the Technical Proposal, the Proposal shall be rejected. 12.3 If the Proposal Security amount or its validity period is found to be less than what is required by UNDP, UNDP shall reject the Proposal. 12.4 In the event an electronic submission is allowed in the BDS, Bidders shall include a copy of the Bid Security in their proposal and the original of the Proposal Security must be sent via courier or hand delivery as per the instructions in BDS. 12.5 The Proposal Security may be forfeited by UNDP, and the Proposal rejected, in the event of any one or combination, of the following conditions: a) If the Bidder withdraws its offer during the period of the Proposal Validity specified in the BDS, or; b) In the event if the successful Bidder fails: i. to sign the Contract after UNDP has issued an award; or 12.6 to furnish the Performance Security, insurances, or other documents that UNDP may require as a condition precedent to the effectivity of the contract that may be awarded to the Bidder. 13. Currencies 13.1 All prices shall be quoted in the currency or currencies indicated in the BDS. Where Proposals are quoted in different currencies, for the purposes of comparison of all Proposals: a) UNDP will convert the currency quoted in the Proposal into the UNDP preferred currency, in accordance with the prevailing UN operational rate of exchange on the last day of submission of Proposals; and b) In the event that UNDP selects a proposal for award that is quoted in a currency different from the preferred currency in the BDS, UNDP shall reserve the right to award the contract in the currency of UNDP's preference, using the conversion method specified above. 14.1 If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint 14. Joint Venture, Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm Consortium or in their Proposal that: (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead Association entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between UNDP and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture. 14.2 After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of UNDP. The lead entity and the member entities of the JV, Consortium or 14.3

Association shall abide by the provisions of Clause 9 herein in respect of

submitting only one proposal.

- 14.4 The description of the organisation of the JV, Consortium or Association must clearly define the expected role of each of the entity in the joint venture in delivering the requirements of the RFP, both in the Proposal and the JV, Consortium or Association Agreement. All entities that comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP.
- 14.5 A JV, Consortium or Association in presenting its track record and experience should clearly differentiate between:
 - a) Those that were undertaken together by the JV, Consortium or Association; and
 - b) Those that were undertaken by the individual entities of the JV, Consortium or Association.
- 14.6 Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
- 14.7 JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi-sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm.

15. Only One Proposal

- 15.1 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.
- 15.2 Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:
 - a) they have at least one controlling partner, director or shareholder in common; or
 - b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or
 - c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or
 - d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process;
 - e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder; or
 - f) some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.

16. Proposal Validity

16.1 Proposals shall remain valid for the period specified in the BDS, commencing

Period	on the Deadline for Submission of Proposals. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UNDP and rendered non-responsive.
	During the Proposal validity period, the Bidder shall maintain its origina Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Personnel, the proposed rates and the total price.
17.Extension of Proposal Validity Period	In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the proposal validity period, UNDP may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their Proposals. The request and the responses shall be made in writing, and shal be considered integral to the Proposal.
	17.2 If the Bidder agrees to extend the validity of its Proposal, it shall be done without any change in the original Proposal.
	17.3 The Bidder has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Proposal, and in which case, such Proposal will not be further evaluated.
18. Clarification of Proposal	18.1 Bidders may request clarifications on any of the RFP documents no later than the date indicated in the BDS. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing in the manner indicated in the BDS. If inquiries are sent other than specified channel, even if they are sent to a UNDP staff member, UNDP shall have no obligation to respond or confirm that the query was officially received.
	18.2 UNDP will provide the responses to clarifications through the method specified in the BDS.

	22.3	Bidders must be aware that the mere act of submission of a Proposal, in and of itself, implies that the Bidder fully accepts the UNDP General Contract Terms and Conditions.

30. Evaluation of Technical and Financial Proposals	30.1	The evaluation team shall review and evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and other RFP documents, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the Section 4 (Evaluation Criteria). A Proposal shall be rendered non-responsive at the technical evaluation stage if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the BDS. When necessary and if stated in the BDS, UNDP may invite technically responsive bidders for a presentation related to their technical proposals. The conditions for the presentation shall be provided in the bid document where required.
	30.2	In the second stage, only the Financial Proposals of those Bidders who achieve the minimum technical score will be opened for evaluation. The Financial Proposals corresponding to Technical Proposals that were rendered non-responsive shall remain unopened, and, in the case of manual submission, be returned to the Bidder unopened. For emailed Proposals and e-tendering submissions, UNDP will not request for the password of the Financial Proposals of bidders whose Technical Proposal were found not responsive.

1. A. Project Title

Strengthening Electoral and Legislative Processes

B. Project Description

Background:

One of the main problems that UNDP's youth empowerment programmes seek to address is the lack of inclusion of youth and marginalized communities in the policymaking process. At the same time, UNDP seeks to support parliaments to become more inclusive and responsive to people's needs and better prepared to meet the requirements and challenges of the 21st century. Since most parliaments are confronted with a lack of public trust, they need to prioritise engagement of the public in their work and decision-making, particularly targeting population groups such as youth whose disengagement could have negative impact on of the future of democracy and democratic institutions in the long term. Besides making parliamentary processes more efficient and effective and enabling the institution to operate in special situations, digitalisation of parliamentary affairs can also be a modern and sustainable solution to addressing the lack of public participation. Digital solutions allow the public at large including youth to monitor and provide inputs on upcoming laws, track government expenditures, and voice their opinions on different issues that are (or should be) on parliamentary agendas. There are numerous examples of digital engagement platforms that can bring parliament and government closer to the people including youth, including the "youthconversations" platform which was developed in collaboration with UNDP Regional Hub for Asia and the Pacific and the country teams in Pakistan, Timor Leste and Bhutan.

While the COVID-19 pandemic acted as a digitalisation accelerator and triggered a host of digital innovations in parliaments, in many countries in the region legislatures remain in the nascent stages of using information technology strategically and systematically. Nevertheless the unprecedented disruptions caused by COVID-19 provide entry points to bring out transformative, innovative and sustainable digital reforms in terms of effectively carrying out parliamentary functions, increasing transparency of parliamentary business, enhancing public involvement in legislative business, reaching out to marginalised groups, and systematically engaging young men and women.

Given the above context, UNDP Bangkok Regional Hub for Asia and the Pacific conducted a two-pronged Regional intervention in 2020-2022 based on (i) a multi-country digital transformation readiness assessment and (ii) a digital engagement platform to enhance youth engagement in legislation and parliamentary decision-making. The intervention enabled assessing the opportunities and challenges faced in mainstreaming digital technology in the parliamentary space in three countries—Bhutan, Pakistan and Timor Leste in the Asia-Pacific Region.

Following successful roll-out of two online conversations with youth in 3 countries in the Region via the youthconversations portal(s)³, where UNDP has received positive feedback from 36,541 on post-COVID challenges and climate change and shared this information with the National parliaments to inform policymaking, UNDP seeks to hire the services of a firm to provide access to an online platform where UNDP would be able to launch multiple/parallel online conversations to cater to the demand from more country offices in the Region for such a service. UNDP would also like to automize the analysis of the data

to facilitate this task for UNDP country office teams who would be using the platform. Collection of demographic data on participants will be an important feature of the platform.

Objective:

UNDP requires the support of a firm to provide UNDP unlimited access to a digital engagement platform to enhance youth engagement in legislation and parliamentary decision-making.

Scope of Work

Outputs:

i. Provide UNDP unlimited access to a Digital Youth-Parliament Engagement Platform for UNDP to promote youth engagement in legislation and parliamentary decision-making across the Region, allowing UNDP to initiate and manage multiple conversations and to have automated analysis of the results of each conversation.

Activities:

- Provide UNDP access to a a customized online engagement platform to gauge nuanced perceptions of youth regarding upcoming issues in the legislative agenda of the National/Sub-National parliaments in consultation with relevant UNDP teams for a period of 34 months with the following features:
- The platform should build on the previous UNDP youth conversations experience, detailed in Annex 1, but will include more advanced features as detailed below.
- The platform will be used by UNDP to host multiple/parallel online conversations. The interface should include a dashboard (suggested to explore the use of google analytics here) to show basic details of ongoing/past conversations, basic demographic indicators of the users (should be each respondent and not limited to IP address to accommodate for the fact that multiple users may come from a common IP) and a basic data analysis and visualization function including numbers of users/number of comments, sector-wise distribution of comments, basic analysis of agreement/disagreement of comments and provide some insights from the analysis.
- The dashboard of the platform should allow UNDP to have access to key indicators related to platform usage, user demographics, etc. in real time and a function which allows data to be compared across different conversations to show common trends and linkages.
- In terms of access to the platform, UNDP would foresee the creation of several UNDP administrators' accounts, which would have access to the overall UNDP dashboard, be able to approve new users and new conversations. While the firm will create some templates for new conversations, further customization of the conversation interface (text/photos/links etc.) should be accounted for.
- The firm will be responsible for all web design/back-end development. The platform would ideally
 have a point of integration with existing UNDP platforms such as Spark blue and other platforms
 under construction.
- Once the prototype platform is approved by UNDP, the firm should run at least one new user conversation simultaneously in 3-4 countries with UNDP on the new platform to test its functionality and suitability. UNDP would be responsible for the outreach to potential users for this test conversation.

- Based on UNDP feedback from the test conversation, the firm should finalize the platform and submit for UNDP approval.
- Following approval, the firm should conduct a training with at least 20 UNDP colleagues on the platform functionality, including the administrator function.
- The firm should provide training materials in ppt/word formats so that they can be adapted and used by UNDP.
- Based on the final platform the firm should prepare a suggested advocacy and communications strategy for UNDP to help onboard and retain external audiences for the platform use.
