1. BACKGROUND & PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Green Climate Fund (GCF)-financed project "Improving the resilience of vulnerable coastal communities to climate change-related impacts in Viet Nam" being implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Viet Nam (henceforth referred to as the GCF project) was approved by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development in Decision No. 3637/QD-BNN-HTQT on September 7, 2017.

The GCF project has three components; the first is providing storm- and floodresilient housing to highly vulnerable and disaster-exposed households, the second is mangrove regeneration, and the third is increased access to enhanced climate, loss and damage data for private and public sector application. More specifically, under Component 2, the objective is to regenerate more than 4,000 hectares of coastal mangroves in storm surge buffer zones using successful evidence-based approaches. To date, Component 2 has been carried out in five provinces, namely Nam Dinh, Thanh Hoa, Quang Nam, Quang Ngai and Ca Mau.

In Thua Thien Hue, according to Decision No. 18/QD-UBND dated January 4, 2018 of the Provincial People's Committee on the establishment of the Provincial Project Management Unit [PPMU] of Thua Thien Hue), the PPMU of Thua Thien Hue is responsible for managing and implementing GCF project activities in accordance with the objectives, progress, quality and resources stated in the project documents approved by the competent authority.

Expected outcomes of the GCF project in Thua Thien Hue province include:

- Component 1: Strengthen the resilience of residential housing infrastructure to the impacts of climate change and supporting stable and safe conditions for 731 households in disaster-prone coastal areas. In the period of 2018-2021, the construction of 581 resilient houses was completed, and these houses are now waiting for adjustments to be made to the project document as part of the project extension process. Accordingly, an additional 150 resilient houses will be built in the province in 2022-2023.

- Component 2: Support the plantation of approximately 40 hectares of coastal mangroves. This component will be implemented in Thua Thien Hue province in 2022. The Provincial People's Committee issued Document No. 8243/UBND-NN dated August 4, 2022 directing the implementation of mangrove plantation in Huong Phong commune.

- Component 3: Increase access to disaster and climate change loss and damage data for use in sustainable development and establish and strengthen the application of disaster and climate risk information systems to support decision-making and planning, taking into account risks of and resilience to climate change.

According to the draft workplan for 2022, the GCF project will support Thua Thien Hue province to plant approximately 40 hectares of coastal mangrove forests. However, due to the delay in the project extension procedure, the PPMU of Thua Thien Hue submitted Official Letter No. 26/GCF dated August 16, 2022 requesting the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) to carry out procurement procedures according to UNDP's process to support direct implementation of Component 2 activities of the GCF project in Thua Thien Hue.

UNDP has agreed to support the recruitment of a consultancy firm for the implementation of the activity entitled "Field survey, technical design and financial estimation for mangrove plantation in 2022 in Huong Phong commune, Hue city, Thua Thien Hue province." As such, UNDP is in pursuit of a national specialized consulting firm/institution to carry out this activity.

2. SCOPE OF WORK AND SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES

2.1. Scope of work

- Work with the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development and the Forest Protection Department of Thua Thien Hue province and the Huong Phong Commune People's Committee to identify locations for the plantation of about 40 hectares mangrove forest in 2022.

- Collect secondary data of proposed locations including land-use planning; general information on natural and socio-economic conditions of the proposed areas; livelihood dependency of the nearby communities; the mangrove forest development proposal in Huong Phong commune; Decision No. 495/QD-UBND dated February 20, 2020 of the People's Committee of Thua Thien Hue province on the establishment of Tam Giang-Cau Hai Wetland Nature Reserve (Thua Thien Hue province); regulations on environmental impact assessments for proposed mangrove plantation areas (if any); and other decisions, regulations and instructions related to the task.

2.2. Technical design

Due to the characteristics of Thua Thien Hue's wetlands, there is no natural alluvial ground, so a mechanized solution is applied to build soft embankments to create beds for mangrove plantation. Technical design requirements include:

- Conducting field surveys to develop a detailed technical design by plot as outlined in Circular No. 29/2018/TT-BNNPTNT dated November 16, 2018 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, which provides technical guidance on silviculture measures, Circular No. 15/2019/TT-BNNPTNT dated October 30, 2019 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, which provides guidance on a number of contents related to the management of silvicultural works and other relevant regulations. These include Decision No. 503/QD-TCLN-PTR dated November 12, 2018 of the General Department of Forestry, which provides technical guidance on temporary afforestation and mangrove restoration under the GCF project, and Document No. 819/TCLN-PTR dated June 3, 2019 of the General Department of Forestry, which provides guidance on the implementation of Component 2 of the GCF project.

- Carrying out surveys, measuring and designing soft embankments to create beds for mangrove plantation according to National Standard TCVN 8478:2018 (Irrigation works - Components, volume of topographic survey in the project formulation and design stages).

- Developing a document on the technical design for mangrove forest plantation and regeneration in 2022 according to the provisions of Circular No. 15/2019/TT-BNNPTNT dated October 30, 2019 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development.

2.3. Financial estimation

- Develop a financial estimation for the proposed work over the entire area to be planted, allocate the annual budget from provincial authority, and create an in-depth breakdown for one hectare of mangrove plantation and protection based on the natural and socio-economic conditions. This is to be done in accordance with the provisions of Circular No. 15/2019/TT-BNNPTNT dated October 30, 2019 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development. Economic and technical norms stipulated in Decision No.

1206/2016/QĐ-BNN-TCLN dated April 8, 2016 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development on the Promulgation of Economic and Technical Norms for seeding, planting, tending to and protecting mangroves are to be applied. Decision No. 1205/2016/QD-BNN-TCLN dated April 8, 2016 of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development on the issuance of technical guidance on afforestation of Kandelia, Black Mangrove, Grey Mangrove, Oriental Mangrove and Crabapple Mangrove and other related regulations are also to be referenced.

- Prepare detailed financial estimation for soft embankments to create beds for mangrove plantation according to the norms of construction cost estimates prescribed in Circular No. 12/2021/TT-BXD dated August 31, 2021 of the Ministry of Construction.

2.4. Consultation

- Conduct consultation meetings to receive comments and additional suggestions from specialized agencies, management agencies, the Component 2 Project Management Unit (PMU), provincial - and district-level authorities, and communities which will be affected by this plantation work on contents related to the technical design and financial estimation.

- Finalize the technical design document and financial estimation for mangrove plantation and submit to GCF's Thua Thien Hue PPMU, the Component 2 PMU and UNDP Viet Nam Office for comments before submitting to relevant competent authorities for appraisal and approval according to regulations.

Technical design document should include concerns and recommendations on alternative livelihoods in case if any households' livelihoods would be affected.

3. CONTRACT DURATION AND EXPECTED PLACES OF TRAVEL

The expected contract duration is from October 15, 2022 to Novem 30, 2022. The maximum number of working days is 45 days.

The consulting firm will work at the office of the PPMU of Thua Thien Hue with field visits to Huong Phong commune, Hue city, Thua Thien Hue province.

The firm will lead consultations with professional and management agencies at the provincial and district levels to receive technical advice, and with the Component 2 PMU to discuss contents related to the technical design and financial estimation of the work.

6. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT

The consulting firm is expected to actively organize, assign and support its members to carry out field surveys to complete the assigned tasks. The PPMU of Thua Thien Hue, UNDP Viet Nam Office, and Component 2 PMU - General Department of Forestry will provide necessary support and contact the related stakeholders during the field assessment. The district and commune units will participate in the field surveys and consultation meetings in the field.
